Chinese Brush Painting with Lisa Curry



Lisa hopes you will have fun learning Chinese brushstroke in a beautiful setting. Chinese painting is like a martial art. You will learn the importance of posture, how to wield the brush, and the state of mind necessary to complete a painting with 'chi' or energy.

Materials List

- Two water containers (yoghurt or margarine-sized cups)
- Chinese liquid ink, small bottle
- Watercolors: Marie's (Chinese) or bring your own if you have western watercolors. Make sure to have yellow and blue.
- A piece of white or light grey felt 1 yard or 1/2 yard if you like to paint smaller
- Chinese paper to paint on: OAS* sells a paper rolls for \$8.
- A roll of paper towels
- Two White Dishes** -one for ink and one for colors. The ink dish should have 2 separate compartments, another can be just a plain dish. A clean watercolor palette with divides is an option.
- I will have brushes for sale at camp. The basic one is \$8. It is important to get a good brush as there are many of different qualities. If you already own Chinese brushes, please bring them.
