UU Summer Camp 2023 Covid Protocols

- The Board of Directors and the UU Camping Ministries Team encourages all campers, volunteers, and staff to be fully vaccinated, including with Bivalent booster.
- Covid-19 vaccinations are no longer a requirement for attending UU Summer Youth, Young Adult and Family camps.
- All campers/volunteers in attendance at any camp must Rapid test for Covid-19 within 24 hours of arrival to camp and prove a negative test result upon check-in at Camp. Campers arriving without proof of a negative test will be given a Rapid test before getting a cabin assignment or assimilating into the camp group.
- A mid-camp Rapid Covid Test will be required of all campers and volunteer staff.
- •A person with a positive Covid-19 test must leave Camp immediately. Registration fees will be refunded for those campers who test positive and need to cancel their participation in Camp. Campers who leave part-way-thru a camp will receive a prorated return of fees.
- The wearing of masks at Camp is optional and is a personal choice. The Medical lead/CMD/Deans reserve the right to ask campers to wear masks if there is a health risk that warrants asking campers to do so.
- The Plexi-glass partition between Campers and Kitchen Staff will remain in place, and food service procedures will continue to meet the high standards of San Bernardino County. Hand sanitizer will be available in the dining hall.
- Dining at Summer Camps will remain outdoor with indoor as an option. For increased ventilation, we ask that all windows remain open in shared building spaces (Lodge, Coffee House, Craig's, Cabin 6, PSWIRL/Library).
